- Lack of Equipment – The office requires additional vehicles and operational equipment to effectively carry out field projects and beautification activities. Many existing units are outdated, non-functional, or have been damaged due to wear and tear, harsh weather conditions, or natural causes. This shortage and deterioration of equipment hinder the office's ability to maintain project efficiency, meet timelines, and deliver consistent service quality to the community.
- Austerity Measures - While the measures aim to achieve fiscal stability, this poses ongoing challenges to efficiency, equity, and the government's ability to meet community needs effectively.
